New Parishioners
If you are new to Wilmington or to Immaculate Conception, we would like to take this opportunity to welcome you. We are an active and vibrant parish and ask, if you have decided to join us, that you will seriously consider giving of your time, talent, and treasure for the Lord's work. Completion of an Interest Card, Parish Registration Form and

attendance to a Welcome/Orientation/Registration Event is part of active membership and provides you with parish mailings. Please find an Interest Card located in the pamphlet rack in the Gathering Area of the church.

Sacramental Life

Infant Baptism: Celebrated monthly. Registered (minimum 3 months) and participating parishioners may schedule infant baptism after completion of a baptism preparation workshop and reception of godparent documents. Contact Gina Drost, Director of Faith Formation, at 910-791-1003, ext 112, preferably prior to the child's arrival. *Children over 7 are not baptized as "infants." Instead they are prepared to receive all 3 sacraments of initiation at a later date.

To Be a Godparent/Sponsor: for Baptism or Confirmation; you must be a registered, participating member for at least 6 months prior to requesting letter.

1st Reconciliation & 1st Eucharist: Second grade is our Sacramental year for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. First grade faith formation is a prerequisite for the second grade Sacramental year. We require four meetings for the parents/guardians of youth receiving these Sacraments.

Confirmation: Confirmation in our Diocese is celebrated in the high school years, and is a two year process. Candidates may enroll in Level I as a freshman with immediate preparation and celebration of the sacrament in Level II the sophomore year. Stewardship opportunities and attendance to a Confirmation retreat are mandatory.

Reconciliation: We celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation/confession, normally, Saturdays from 3:30-4:30 pm in the Church's Reconciliation Room. In addition, the sacrament is available by appointment. Please call the Parish Office to speak to the pastor.

RCIA: Adults seeking Initiation into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church are invited to contact Gina Drost, gdrost@iccwilm.org or 791-1003, ext.112

Matrimony: Only parishioners registered at ICC for at least 6 months may request to be married here. The couple must meet with a priest before setting a date and at least 6 months in advance of an anticipated wedding in order to complete the preparation process. All aspects of marriage planning requires the participation and approval of trained personnel. Contact: Claudia Sing, csing@iccwilm.org., 791-1003, ext. 100.

Anointing of the Sick: Anyone who is seriously ill or who is anticipating surgery or an extended hospital stay or who is weakened because of a prolonged illness or advanced age is encouraged to call the Parish Office to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Funerals: After a funeral director has been contacted but before any arrangements have been made public, the funeral director will contact the Parish Office in order to arrange for funeral time and/or vigil service. All aspects of parish funeral liturgy planning requires the participation and approval of trained parish personnel.

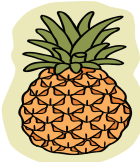

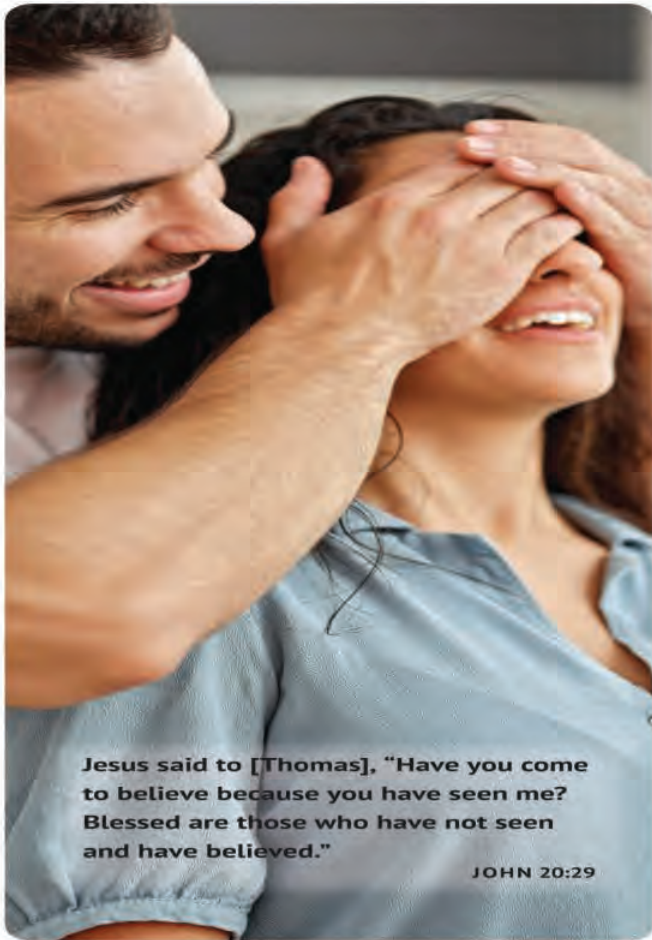

The Importance of Trust

We can readily understand Thomas' insistence upon seeing things with his own eyes. Would you believe it if someone told you that a friend whose funeral you had attended was now walking through walls?

At some time or other, all of us have been tricked into believing something we later found out was untrue and remember how foolish we felt. Haven't our parents told us not to believe everything we hear? Haven't our teachers taught us to do our own research? Doubt serves a valuable purpose, and we would be naïve to disregard it.

At the same time, we know that doubt can become a way of life, overstepping its usefulness. During the COVID pandemic, for example, some refused to believe even the most knowledgeable medical voices in the nation. Like Thomas, they insisted that unless they'd "done their own research," they wouldn't believe. Such a stance ignores that unless you are a scientist working in a medical lab, even "your own research" will be based on an act of belief that what you are reading of others' research is correct. Doubt is good, but only in combination with a healthy dose of humility. In the end, the world turns on an axis of trust.

At the close of today's gospel, Jesus names as "blessed" those able to discern what is true and believe not only because of what they have seen with their own eyes but also because of what they have heard through their ears from sources worthy of their trust. •

EverTide Presents “I AM”

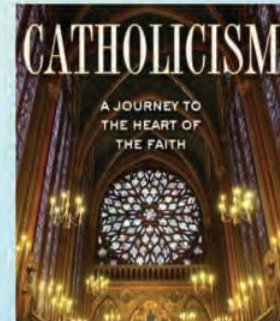

ONE ACTION AT A TIME

The ability to lift others, especially those who feel the least amount of importance or self-worth, is a God-like ability that is integral to changing the world to a more optimistic and unified place. If I have taken away any aspect of my church community at Immaculate Conception, it is that we are one close family who looks out for others. Being in a religious community means more than just going to mass; it's a commitment to an encouraging support group who have your back. Lifting others in times when they feel worthless helps create a positive tomorrow. Whether it's reaching out to a mentally wounded Grannie, transporting food drive materials, or helping a classmate, that simple act of supporting one another will empower the lives of the least.

Uplifting others has a special place in my heart. My Grannie, who has positively influenced my life, lives in Trinidad and Tobago. Living 2071 miles away, she is negatively affected by hardships in her home country. I call her every night and say prayers with her, which brightens her darkest moments. I know when she hangs up the phone, I have uplifted her and put a smile on her face. When she visits, living in a multigenerational household has influenced me to look out for others in their time of need. Every morning, before my parents and I go to mass, we help transport food drive cans and load them into a truck. This small gesture can help people in need of nutrition and create a better church community by looking out for others. In my school community, I always look out for those who are down. Some refer to me as the guy always with a smile on his face. Every time I look out for those in my community, I remember my Grannie's mental struggles. Her resilience inspires me to help others in need. I utilize my awareness of others' needs to better my religious, scholastic, and home communities.

Uplifting others is a warm feeling few truly get to experience; it is like a golden sunrise on a tropical beach, with nature being in harmony through the simple act of the sun rising. Those who are not mentally able, physically able, or economically stable are all affected by the negative outlooks the world has, and are referred to as the least of these. The least of these symbolizes people at their lowest point, but one simple action of encouragement could better these people. This simple gesture can help many, resulting in an empathetic and positive tomorrow. When we lift the least of these, we do more than simply help others; we become the people Christ calls us to be.

Reminder of Parking Lot Courtesies

With Easter approaching, and the increase of new visitors to ICC, here are a few reminders of parking courtesy . . .

- ✚ You are invited to drop off passengers at the front walkway to the Gathering Area, but this is an emergency lane and parking is NOT allowed at any time.
- ✚ Handicap parking is available in the front of the church, and is clearly marked.
- ✚ Please be good stewards and park ONLY in lined parking spots. There is additional parking along the side of the church with a second entrance to the Gathering Area in the back.
- ✚ Our church is located on a very busy highway. To ensure a safe and speedy exit from the parking lot following our weekend Liturgies, we have paid Sheriff Deputies directing traffic. Please watch them carefully and follow their lead.
- ✚ We appreciate that so many of our parishioners want to be courteous and stop and allow people out of their parking spot, but that interrupts the flow of exiting. The Sheriff Deputies have asked us to remind everyone that they are only allowed to stop traffic for a few minutes at a time, so it is very helpful to keep the flow going while the traffic is stopped.
- ✚ We know that everyone has someplace to be after Liturgy, but that should not preclude common courtesy. Please practice an attitude of patience, and follow the proper flow to exit the church parking lot. It is up to each of us to do our part and keep everyone safe and accident free.
- ✚ And, lastly, but not least: the parking lot is not continually patrolled during service times, so please make sure to lock your car, and remove all valuables when you come to Liturgy. It's always better to be safe than sorry.

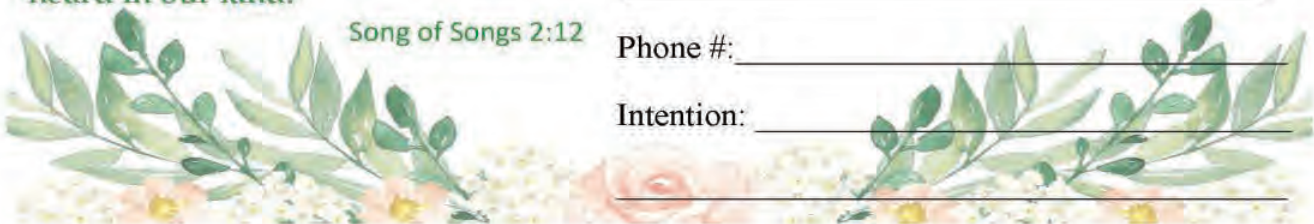
