

My Family Meal

“The table is central to Catholic rituals. It is at the altar that the great meal, Eucharist, occurs. As we pass on the faith to our children, it is paramount that they understand the sacred nature of that table and every table in their lives. The kitchen table, the dining room table and even the coffee table have a presence all their own in our homes. It is at table that



we nourish both our bodies and our souls. Sitting together sharing a hearty winter meal is the perfect place to share the matters of the spirit. As we look at the Scriptures we see, again and again, that Jesus did his best work at mealtimes. In fact, it was when he broke bread and blessed it that the Emmaus couple finally recognized him. That tells us that it was a familiar sight and that Jesus put great stock in table time. So, too, should we put emphasis on the ritual and manner of the way we celebrate life and growth at all our tables, sacred and secular. Tables have a holiness all their own.” (American Catholic)

You may use the shape patterns and other colored felt in the kit or supply your own materials, remembering to use only symbols connected with our Catholic faith tradition. Make sure that your child's name is on the front of the banner, and that the banner is created in Portrait orientation, as seen below.
